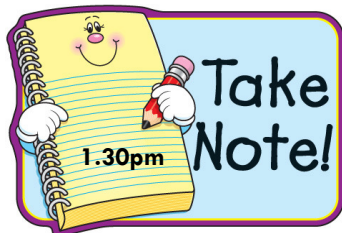

FESTIVAL ENTRY GUIDELINES

Fiddle Any three Scottish tunes of the competitor's own choice from any of the following: Slow Air: Slow Strathspey: Strathspey :Reel: Jig: March: Hornpipe
Accordion
Piano
Keyboard
 Fiddle may be accompanied, except for Intermediate Slow Strathspey all others unaccompanied. Scottish Waltz may be played on Piano and Keyboard
Keyboard: Not digital piano - judge looking for pre-programmed rhythms and sounds to enhance performance

MISCELLANEOUS

Tin Whistle Juniors may play two tunes all other sections as Accordion
Mouth Organ Any two Scottish tunes of the competitor's own choice from any of the following, unaccompanied
Jews Harp
Diddling Slow Air: Slow Strathspey : Strathspey: Reel: Jig: March: Waltz

Melodeon As Accordion

Music Groups Choice of own traditional Scottish Tunes not to exceed 5mns

Doric Writing Should be previously unpublished and Open section entries should **NOT** have the author's name on the piece but on a separate sheet

Junior Writing Sections may be changed to suit the amount of entries e.g. add another age group

Storytelling Spoken in Doric and a **maximum of 15mns**
 Points will be deducted for overrun
